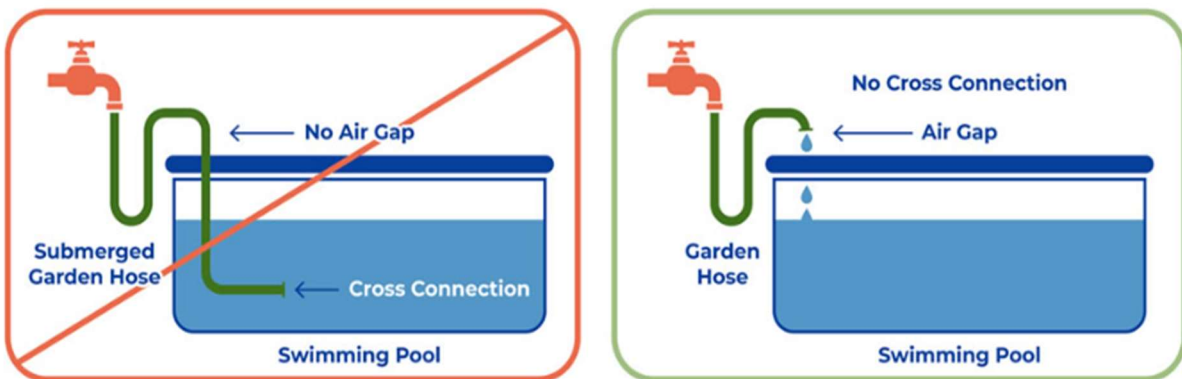

The best way to prevent a cross connection is with an **Air Gap**, which is vertical separation between the potable water supply outlet and flood level rim of the receiving vessel. This prevents contaminated water from reversing into the clean water supply by breaking the connection.



Any pools, saunas or hot tubs that are filled using a hose should use an **Atmospheric Vacuum Breaker** at the hose bibb to prevent a cross connection.
